### It's a Dual Role For Iraqi Actress

Let's face it. It's very difficult to write a calm, dispassionate review of a summer-theater production when the reviewer feels that a brilliant Frustage story is indicated, instead.

At the same time, there is the Miss Devlin whose family is so closely involved with violent events taking place this week in the near east that she has not been sure that she would be able to finish out the week as Marie in "The River Line."

Shirin Devlin is a trouper. The show goes on. On Wednesday night, she did a magnificent job as a Frenchwoman who bonded during the war, hiding allied soldiers in her father's granary, moving them on to less perilous refuges.

There are roles in this drama that are less important than others, but here a number of roles as such. Each character has a significant job to do.

Paul Yanger, who has developed into an outstanding actor, resourceful, subtle, versatile, who can be a very funny comedian one week and make his audience weep when he plays serious drama the following week, puts a whole spectrum of emotional shadings into his characterization of the Englishman who married Marie after he had done her bidding, and a deed of sudden violence, in wartime.

And there are admirably sought performances of equal subtlety presented by Michael McGuire, as an American school teacher who finds himself harassed and tortured by his memiors of the river line, by Hugh Wilton, as an appealing but mysterious fugitive from the Nazis who speaks distinctly perfect German and leaves a great many things admirably unexplained to the group living in the granary, by Ken Boyer as a touching, youthful British girl who tries heroically to be brave; and by William Kimer, authentic and convincing as Marie's father.

Two women share honors with Miss Devlin: Deborah Trisell and Mary Latimer. They appear only in the pasteur scenes; but the English girl portrayed by Mrs. Trisell has the closest of liab with that little group of people who hid out in the French granary together four years earlier.

This is no easy role to play; it requires the delivery of lines that could be manifold and muddy, but that sound true and honest as Deborah Trisell speaks them.

And Miss Latimer, who's in danger of becoming the Curt Shuster's 1958 dream girl. She plays the part of the English
